This ministry is a confidential ministry. Those receiving care will not be public information. The content of a caring visit will also be confidential. So there is a trust that can grow as one listens and cares for another. As with our weekly prayers, only as one gives permission can this be shared.



Compassion Care ministers will be caring for those dealing with many of life's crisis. It will include those who are facing illness, facing serious loss and grief. This might be the death of a loved one, one experiencing the pain of divorce, and other concerns of life where care would be welcomed.
