March 15 – Planning our Funerals: One day each of us will die. Join Pastors Barbara and Jen in discussion and reflection about funeral planning and this final celebration of our baptismal journey. Consider the hopes, values and desires that you may share with your loved ones. Hear how our pastors talk with people in advance of death and how they work with families in preparation for a service.

March 22 – Lutheran Campus Ministry, Young Adulthood, and the Future of the Church: Studies reveal that fewer young people are attending church. Yet, they fail to account for the deep faithfulness of the students who are actively engaged with a faith community, the ways they are reaching out across boundaries, the counter-cultural nature of their practice, and the ways they are, and will continue, to shape the church and world into the future. March is Minnesota Food Share Month We can help! Bring food pantry items or hygiene supplies to drop off in our grocery cart and/or give a financial donation to help our local food shelf make purchases. Note that financial donations purchase much more food for food shelves than we can buy with the same money. \*Items suggested: Cooking oils, sugar and flour, toilet paper, hygiene products (deodorant, toothbrushes and paste), canned chicken, tuna and chili. Nearly one in ten Minnesotans experience food insecurity (USDA), 13.8% of children in Minnesota are food insecure (Feeding America). Make checks to ULCH memo: food shelf.
