Advent 2020 Toolkit

General Preparation

Find a space in your home that is central, focal, but not "in the way"— coffee table, kitchen table, on top of the piano, etc. Ideally this is a space you can easily access from where you do church on Sunday mornings and Wednesday evenings, because we will light our wreaths as part of worship.

- 1) Gather five candles they don't have to match.
- 2) Find a **blue cloth** even a dish towel or wash cloth will do.
- 3) If you have any **greenery** in your home real or faux plants pick some out to join the fun.
- 4) Gather other **small objects or decorations** that are blue.
- 5) Gather five small **objects that have special meaning** for you, or that symbolize dreams, hopes, goals you have, or that remind you of a time when you felt something deeply love, joy, loss, healing.

Assemble an altar space and "wreath." On top of the blue cloth, set four candles in a circle, choosing the best one for the center. These candles will mark our passage of time through the four weeks, and the center one will be the Christ light at Christmas. Amidst the candles, set any greenery how you'd like. We adorn our homes with greenery especially at



this time of year to extol the hidden life that still dwells in nature despite the frozen cold. Place your chosen objects around, inviting your memories, dreams, and symbols of meaning into this space.

Add or subtract from these instructions in any way that suits you. The goal is to create a devotional space that is authentic to you. There is no wrong way to do this.

As the season progresses, add things to your devotional space as you feel inspired. Choose a day of the week apart from our normal worship times to spend 10 minutes in your devotional space with your household. Use this pattern as a guide:

- 1) Read scripture one or more of the readings printed for the week or day. Use your bible or look up excerpts using Oremus Bible Browser https://bible.oremus.org/
- 2) During the reading, **light** the candle(s) appropriate for the week. One Christmas Eve and Christmas Day, be sure to light the center candle.
- 3) Observe a bit of silence around the Advent wreath.
- 4) Talk and tell about anything that the key word(s), scripture, or prayer brings up for you. Stories, images, ideas.
- 5) Speak the **prayer** printed for the week or day.
